Introduction

The [Master of International Trade](#) program from [Victoria University of Wellington](#) (New Zealand) is **ranked second in the world** in the [International Trade Rankings 2023](#).

The multi-discipline program curriculum – which covers legal, economic and political aspects of international trade – allows students to develop a holistic view when examining highly fluid trade trends and challenges. Such a unique approach is facilitated by the university's rich connections to local and international entities in the capital of Wellington, ensuring that students are well-informed about theory and actual practices of trade.

The program maintains a wide variety of course formats, ranging from traditional lectures with internationally renowned faculty and industry leaders to student-led seminars, collaborative hands-on projects on international economic law, and internship placement with the school's public or private partner institutions.

Industry Engagement

Taking advantage of its central location in the heart of New Zealand, the Victoria University of Wellington maintains strong academic and working relations with not only governmental agencies and businesses but also social enterprises and grass-root organizations. This diverse range of partnerships **ranks the university second in the world for Industry Engagement** and grants students access to resources, networks, expertise and opportunities during and after their study.



Innovative Teaching

The multitude of the school's connections to industry and governmental bodies also allows it to diversify how courses are taught and how progress is assessed. In addition to classroom lectures and discussion, students can sign up for the TradeLab Clinic, a pragmatic group project where they address the legal complexity of international economic activities, or take up an internship in the school's multi-sector partner network, including the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade, European Parliament, business and legal agencies. With high-quality teaching and pedagogy, the university **lands the seventh place for Innovative Teaching**.



Trade Program Content

The Master of International Trade provides a unique opportunity to study trade, offering profound knowledge on international trade economics, law and political economy, as well as a host of social and cultural variables impacting trade on a global scale.
